Maria"

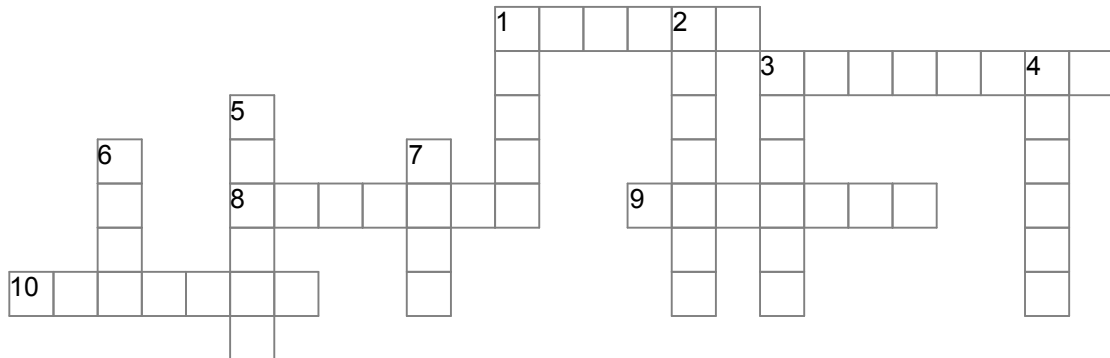
